WHOOPING COUGH (PERTUSSIS):

Don't Wait Until it's Too Late. Currently, many states are reporting an increase in the numbers of pertussis cases. In New York State, there are 163 cases year-to-date as compared to 88 cases at this time last year. This is especially true in California where seven infants have died from the disease this year. These children were too young to have started their vaccinations or had not finished their primary series. Make sure your children are protected from this serious, easily spread disease by checking with their physician to make sure they are up to date. The symptoms of this disease start out as coughing and sneezing with a runny nose and it is often mistaken for a cold. But the coughing becomes steadily worse becoming violent and rapid. Very

often the victim cannot catch their breath until they are forced to breathe in. When they inhale, a loud "whoop" is heard. The disease is spread by the droplets from an infected person's cough and sneezes. Pertussis is most severe in babies and is a leading cause of infant death. Most babies are infected by parents, older children and caregivers as well as children who have never been vaccinated. Adults should be boosted against this disease. Ask your physician about the adult pertussis immunization. If you have any questions, please the Schuyler County Health Department at 535-8140.

NEW CHILD CARE LAW PASSED REQUIRING FIRST AID AND CPR TRAINING.

On August 13, 2010, a law passed requiring all Office of Children and Family Services regulated child care sites to have at least one person with a valid certification in First Aid and CPR on the premises during child care hours of operation. The certification required a course of study in First Aid knowledge and skills and cardiopulmonary resuscitation iwth an emphasis on providing aid to children. The course must also be approved by the Commissioner of the Office of Children and Family Services. Previously Child Care Providers were required to attend training in specific topic areas; however First Aid and CPR were not specified as required. According to the National Association of Resource and Referral Agencies, 85% of parents believe that all child care providers are trained in first aid and CPR. Child Care sites include Family and Group Family Child Care Homes, School-Age Child Care Programs and Child Care Centers. PHOSPHORUS FREE NEWYORK-

Governor Paterson recently signed into law a bill (S.3780-B/A.8914-B) to limit the amount of phosphorus entering the waters of New York State. Over thirty years ago, when dishwashers were less commonly used, the Environmental Conservation Law (ECL) banned phosphorus in laundry detergents. The new bill, sponsored by Senator Antoine Thompson (D-parts of Erie & Niagara Counties), amends the ECL to prohibit the sale and distribution of phosphorus containing dishwashing detergents (commercial and household) and the application of phosphorus containing lawn and turf fertilizers; with exceptions to establishing new lawn or a soil test indicating phosphorus deficiency.
